Club Test Chairs work as a team with Club Coaches to develop a system for organizing assessments and arranging for the necessary paperwork and to complete tasks associated with reporting results of assessments to Skate Canada	Club Test Chairs select their own test dates and contact and confirm Section Evaluators from the Section Officials List for Low Test days	Region High Test Coordinator is the liaison between the Club Test Chair and the Section Test Administrator. Communication flows back and forth from the Club Test Chair to the Region High Test Coordinator to the Section Test Administrator

**NEW** High Test days include the following levels: Senior Silver and Gold Free Skate, Skating Skills & Dance, Diamond Dance along with Silver and Gold Interpretive test

Low tests can be included in a High test day but requires the approval of the assigned Evaluator or the Club Test Chair can arrange for an additional Evaluator(s) to cover the Low tests

For all levels of tests the Club Test Chair is responsible for providing the necessary Skate Canada test sheets and record the test day results on Test Day Summary Sheets

Clubs Test Chairs are responsible for submitting the Test Day Summary Sheets to Member Services at Skate Canada within one week of the test day.

NEW THIS YEAR: Test chairs who have administrative access to the Membership Site can now submit test results online.

NEW THIS YEAR: Updating of test summary sheets: Clubs/skating schools must go into club registration files to check that correct information has been entered and if incorrect, notify Skate Canada promptly. Skaters should also check information.
