## CHAIR'S MESSAGE



DEAR MEMBERS OF SKATE CANADA: ALBERTA-NWT/NUNAVUT,

The Skate Canada: Alberta-NWT/Nunavut Section strived to create momentum as we moved through Year 3 of our 2014-2018 Strategic Plan. This plan is focused on moving forward in Five Strategic Imperatives – Skate for Life, Delivery Capacity, Brand, Partnerships and Skate to Win.

To support the Skate for Life Imperative, the Section increased the number of grants provided to clubs offering opportunities for Inclusive Skating. Support to Adult Skaters included organizing an exciting seminar with Elvis Stojko! We have engaged in discussions with both Speed Skating Clubs about potential development of a cross promotion strategy and with Active Schools to promote CanSkate@School. We will continue that momentum with increased connections with Speed Skating Clubs, schools and other partnerships. We promoted ParticipAction's 150 Skating Day throughout the Section as part of 2017 Canada 150 Celebration.

Preparing for the changes to the STAR Program is another focus for us. We will increase our momentum as these changes become mandatory this September. Competitive opportunities for younger skaters in the STAR competition model are important and we need to provide the best environment for our younger skaters and encourage athletes to transition along the LTAD athlete pathway. Our Special Olympics skaters competed at the Special Olympics World Winter Games in March 2017 and made us proud with 3 gold medals!

The Leading Edge Series was implemented this year to provide an additional recognition pathway for STARSkate and competititive athletes. Trophies and medals were awarded to skaters with the highest total points from events competed in throughout the year. This initiative is creating momentum and excitement for our skaters.

Increasing Delivery Capacity continues to move forward in the Section. This year, the Coaching Committee has taken steps to establish a mentoring program to provide advice to clubs and coaches. Several momentum-build-ing training opportunities for officials were delivered in new and unique ways. We are excited that many officials have worked hard to acquire promotions. We will strive to maintain this momentum.

The Delivery Capacity of the Board and various committees has been redefined with the development of the Governance Charter. Reviewed bylaws and policies and processes have been prepared to guide us as we move ahead with our new Board Structure.

The Board will develop Section direction and goals and the operating committees and staff will carry out the work required to achieve the goals.

The Skate Canada: Alberta-NWT/Nunavut Brand was well represented at all Section events throughout the 2016-2017 season. We have updated our technology with a new live streaming system that has resulted in improved quality and increased views. To continue moving forward in this Strategic Plan pillar, the level of support provided by Section staff was redefined for various events.

CHAIR'S MESSAGE

Building and maintaining successful relationships is important for our Section. It is key that we continue to improve our relationships with Skate Canada, Skate Canada Sections, Alberta Sport Connection and other organizations. 

The OCC implemented a working group structure to assist with Wild Rose and Sectionals to assist the Technical Representatives and to integrate learning opportunities into these events.

The Competition Committee worked this season to create policies, processes and additional templates to assist the hosting of competitions and to ensure that the technical information is reached to our membership. The Leading Edge Series was implemented this season to create an additional recognition to both the Competitive and STARSkate athletes. The Leading Edge Series is recognition based on a skater attending a number of competitions throughout the season.



Enhancing the live streaming experience was also main focus this season. New live streaming equipment was purchased and used for the first time at the 2017 Sectional Championships. At the conclusion of each live streamed competition, each skater's program will be uploaded and available to view on the Section's YOU-Tube channel.



THE AWARDS COMMITTEE completed a review and forecast of current awards during the year. We were pleased that the Fort Macleod Skating Club continued to support the Jesse Smith Memorial Award, donating funds to cover the next five years.


Overall award nominations were down 30% from 2016 levels and the number of clubs participating fell 21% to 34 clubs in 2017. 48 Clubs submitted nominations for the Marilyn Chidlow Volunteer Award, comparable to prior years. CLUBS AND SKATING SCHOOLS continue to host test days, carnivals, seminars, training courses and CanSkate Element Events. During the 2016-2017 season, the CanSkate Element Events have grown. These club events provide CanSkaters and those transitioning into the STAR program an opportunity to showcase their skills in a fun environment. These fun events continue to evolve and the Section is pleased to see clubs and schools supporting the skaters' development.

Two skaters from the Medicine Hat Skating Club were given the opportunity to skate with Kurt Browning in the Medicine Hat Holiday On Ice Show held Dec 3, 2016!

The Section received donated funds from the NATIONAL ICE THEATRE OF CANADA to support initiatives for our clubs and members. Clubs that had a gaming license could apply to the Section to receive funding. The response was great with 80 clubs submitting applications with each club receiving \$500.





The Regions Committee focused on educating clubs and schools on resources available on the Skate Canada Info Centre and the Section website. Clubs and schools continue to look for ways to best utilize their resources to support their skaters and programming, especially in rural communities. In rural areas, some coaches do travel between communities to assist other clubs and schools in the delivery of their programming. Communication is key amongst clubs and volunteers to share resources and ideas to provide wonderful skating experiences.

SKATE CANADA: ALBERTA-NWT/NUNAVUT'S overall membership continues to increase each season. The Section continues to advertise the importance of Skate for Life and to encourage those of all ages to learn to skate and be on the ice. Section clubs and skating schools support this goal through the advertising of all Skate Canada programs, especially CanSkate, CanPowerSkate and Synchronized Skating.

The Section has also had a strong focus on increasing our delivery capacity to support skaters' growth and development. The 2016-2017 season has seen an increased number of coaches being registered and officials in all disciplines have seen a growth in promotions as well as welcoming new officials. The participation with males 10 and under in our sport continues to stay steady and grow slightly. This increase is the result of advertising the benefits of learning to skate that compliment other ice sports, such as hockey, ringette, speed skating or just skating for fun.

## Athlete Development

2016-2017 was full of achievements for athletes from our Section and we could not be more proud. Section athletes served as wonderful ambassadors of our sport not only across Canada but internationally as well. Challenge began with Brian Chiem becoming the 2017 Pre-Novice Men's National Champion.

At the 2017 Canadian Tire National Skating Championships, Jessica and Jackson Behiel received a bronze medal in the Novice Dance competition. This was the first medal in dance for our Section in 20 years. A milestone certainly worth celebrating! Pair team Takara Dei and Josh Venema won a bronze medal in Novice Pair, while Dawson Nodwell took home the silver medal in Novice Men. Keegan Messing earned his position back on the Senior National Team with his 5th place finish in Senior Men and Kaetlyn Osmond claimed her 3rd National Championship Title in Senior Womens. Kaetlyn then went on to capture the silver medal at the 2017 World Figure Skating Championships in Helsinki!

### MONITORING

MONITORING of Section athletes was ongoing from April through preparations for the 2017 Canadian Tire National Skating Championships in January. All Section Junior Development Team and Select Team athletes benefited from regular monitoring by Provincial to Olympic level officials.

### Seminars

The SPRING DEVELOPMENT CAMP hosted in Calgary at WinSport had 104 participants. International coaches and Olympians Yuka Sato and Natalia Annenko lead the on-ice sessions while the off-ice components were lead by Martin Lefevbre, Shayne Johnson, Kaleb Takeste and Angela Duffy.



Two THEATRE ON ICE PERFORMANCE CAMPS were held in the fall, one in Edmonton and one in Calgary. These camps were made possible from funding by the National Ice Theatre of Canada. A total of 30 skaters participated in the two camps. The camps were facilitated off-ice by actor Trevor Campbell and on-ice with coach and choreographer Elina Viola. The camps offered a unique opportunity to participating athletes, its and style and structure received a great response from all participants!

The 2017 BRIAN POCKAR MALE SEMINAR was held in February in Calgary with 25 skaters participating and learning from Olympic coaches Doug Leigh and Scott Davis. Off-ice hip-hop and flexibility was facilitated by Kaleb Takeste. The skaters enjoyed two days of comradery and even fit in some off-ice bowling fun!

A NO RISK ELEMENT EVENT was held in conjunction with the 2017 Brian Pockar Male Seminar. This initiative was funded from year two of the Canada Winter Games funding. A total of 21 Juvenile and Pre-Novice competitive skaters were selected to attend based on their technical content from the 2017 Sectional Championships. They performed a short program and isolated elements over two days and shared a talk from Doug Leigh with the male seminar skaters. Officials for this event were Leslie Lawrence (Senior Canadian Judge) and Scott Davis (ISU Technical Specialist). Doug Leigh provided additional feedback to the skaters from a coaching perspective.

## Athlete Testing with Alberta Sport Development Centres

40 Section athletes were tested to determine their fitness levels to assist with the development of appropriate off-ice training programs. This was an initiative sponsored 50% by the Alberta Sport Connection. Follow up testing and data collection will take place in May 2017.
