**Fees:** Individual event fee: \$40 for the first event, \$30 for any additional events

**Entries:** Entrants in Events shall be: a) Eligible persons as defined in Skate Canada Rule Book Section 2100 b) Be Associate members in good standing of the Association. All event entries will be accepted only from skaters who are members of affiliated Skate Canada clubs.

\*Registration forms **MUST BE COMPLETED IN FULL** or they may not be processed!

**Late Entries:** There will be absolutely no late entries accepted after the deadline. No exceptions.

**Refund of Entry Fee:** ***NO refunds will be made after the closing date.*** Entry fees shall be refunded *only* if the event is not held.

**Check in on Event Day:** Skaters must register and report to the Ice Captain one hour prior to their scheduled Category. Skaters who will be performing to their own music must hand in two copies of their music on a DC

**Schedule and Cancellation of Events:** The host club reserves the right to cancel events or limit the number of entries due to time constraints or ice availability.

**Warm Up Times:** Skate Canada has standardized warm up times for all events. Warm up times for all CanSkate events will be 3 minutes.

**Accidents:** The Association and Committee of the Host Club undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by the skater. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in these Events, all skaters and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the skater's person and property resulting from, or caused by, or connected with the conduct and management of the events. An agreement must also be deemed to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the Association, the Host Club, and their officers. Entries shall be accepted only in accordance with these conditions.

## CANSKATE ELEMENTS EVENT

These elements will be skated on a predetermined circuit similar to regular CanSkate circuits.

### Stage 1:

- Snow slide steps
- Fwd push/glide sequence
- 2-ft jump
- Bwd 2-ft skating/walking

### Stage 2:

- Fwd stop
- Fwd 2-ft sculling
- Fwd 2-ft turn (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- Bwd 2-ft sit glide

### Stage 3:

- Fwd circle thrusts (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- Bwd 2-ft jump
- 2-ft quick turn fwd to bwd and bwd to fwd\* (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- Bwd 2-ft sculling

### Stage 4:

- Bwd circle thrusts (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- Bwd 360° step turn (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- 2-ft jump fwd to bwd and bwd to fwd\* (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- Fwd inside slalom

Stage 5:

- Fwd 2-ft side stop (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- Bwd push/glide sequence, full perimeter (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- Fwd power jump
- Fwd crosscuts - figure-8

Stage 6:

- Fwd 1-ft side stop (L or R - skater's choice)
- Bwd perimeter skating with crosscuts (CW or CCW determined by draw)
- Fwd 180° step turn (mohawk) (RFI-LBI or LFI-RBI -skater's choice)
- Fwd outside edges

\*Note: Some element requirements are actually two skills combined (e.g. 2-ft jump fwd to bwd and bwd to fwd). This was done for ease of delivery and assessment (simple and measurable performance criteria created to reflect the execution of the skill in both directions).

## **CANSKATE PROGRAM EVENT**

***The program will be skated to music provided by the host club, and will be skated on 1/2 ice. Program requirements are the same as the elements portion. Connecting steps may be included, as well as beginning and ending poses. Program length may not exceed one minute.***

Stage 4:

- Bwd circle thrusts (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- Bwd 360° step turn (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- 2-ft jump fwd to bwd and bwd to fwd\* (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- Fwd inside slalom

Stage 5:

- Fwd 2-ft side stop (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- Bwd push/glide sequence, full perimeter (CW or CCW - skater's choice)
- Fwd power jump
- Fwd crosscuts - figure-8

Stage 6:

- Fwd 1-ft side stop (L or R - skater's choice)
- Bwd perimeter skating with crosscuts (CW or CCW determined by draw)
- Fwd 180° step turn (mohawk) (RFI-LBI or LFI-RBI -skater's choice)
- Fwd outside edges

## **SPIN AND JUMP ELEMENT EVENT**

Individual jump and spin events will be performed in isolation and skaters will take turns within their flight.

For Jump Option A and Spin Option A, skaters must have passed their Stage 6 CanSkate but not have passed their STAR 1 Freeskate. Both Option B and C Events will require skaters to have passed STAR 1 Freeskate and working on STAR 2 or 3.

### Jump Option A

- Waltz Jump
- Salchow
- Toe Loop

### Jump Option B

- Salchow
- Loop jump
- Flip jump
- Waltz jump Toe Loop combination

### Jump Option C

- Flip Jump
- Lutz jump
- Loop loop combination
- Salchow toe loop combination

### Spin Option A

- Two foot forward upright spin
- One foot upright spin
- Back spin

### Spin Option B

- Back spin
- Sit spin
- Camel spin
- One foot upright/ back spin combination

### Spin Option C

- Back spin
- Camel sit combination spin
- Upright change spin
- Back sit spin

## **CREATIVE PROGRAM**

Skaters will hear a piece of music selected by the host club twice in warm-up. They will perform a creative routine on the ice to the music selection. Program length should not exceed one (1:30) minute.

Skaters must have passed Stage 6 Canskate.

Skaters will be categorized by age and level.
