

32 athletes representing the Skate Canada: Alberta-NWT/Nunavut Section set to compete against Canada's best skaters at the 2020 Canadian Tire National Skating Championships in Mississauga

Edmonton – Today marks the start of the 2020 Canadian Tire National Skating Championships in Mississauga, Ontario and Alberta will once again have a strong presence among the 250 skaters vying for the National title this week. Along with the National title, athletes at this competition will vie for spots on the Skate Canada National Team who will compete at the 2020 ISU World Figure Skating Championships, the 2020 ISU Four Continents Figure Skating Championships and the 2020 ISU World Junior Figure Skating Championships.

"As Minister responsible for sport I would like to commend the phenomenal athletes headed to represent Alberta at the Canadian Championship for their hard work and dedication that enabled them to earn their place on Team Alberta-NWT/Nunavut. "The Section is incredibly proud of our Skaters that are competing at the Canadian Championships this week" states Bobbi Jo Martin, Chair of Skate Canada: Alberta-NWT/Nunavut Section "All of their hard

work and determination has culminated in their participation in this National event, and we are excited to watch them as they compete against the best skaters in the country"

In the senior men's events Keegan Messing (Ice Palace Figure Skating Club) will be the one to keep an eye on as he looks for the top spot after finishing third at last year's event and recently placed 4<sup>th</sup> at both the ISU GP Skate America 2019, and the ISU GP Shiseido Cup of China 2019. Eric Liu (Ice Palace Figure Skating Club), a member of the Skate Canada Next Gen Team, will also be looking for a podium finish after placing 2<sup>nd</sup> at the 2020 Skate Canada Challenge in November.

13-year-old reigning Novice Women Canadian Champion Kaiya Ruiter from the Glencoe Club in Calgary, also a Skate Canada Next Gen Team Member, will be competing in the Junior Women category this year.

And all eyes will be on her as she continues to demand attention after placing 6<sup>th</sup> overall in Junior Ladies at the ISU Junior Grand Prix in Egna-Neumarkt, Italy in October, and winning Gold in Junior Women at the 2020 Skate Canada Challenge in November.

Other Alberta skaters to be watching for this year are Matthew Newnham (Ice Palace Figure Skating Club), who placed third at last years Canadian Championships in Novice Men, and who also finished third in November at the 2020 Skate Canada Challenge his first year competing in Junior Men. In Novice Dance, Mia Saunders (Calalta Figure Skating Club) and William Oddson (Huntington Hills Skating Club) finished first at Sectionals and brought home the Bronze medal from 2020 Skate Canada Challenge.
