Skate Alberta-NWT/NUN will be hosting an ONLINE Evaluator Training Seminar for new candidates. This seminar will feature an introduction to effective evaluating skills, training on feedback and communication (soft skills), discipline overviews and much more.

This training is reserved for officials, coaches do not qualify to attend this training. This training is reserved for individuals who are new candidates or currently involved in the officiating community and wish to pursue evaluating. Interested individuals must meet the criteria outlined below to participate:

- 16 years of age
- Skating Background:
 1. Any two of Junior Bronze/STAR 5 Free Skating, Skills, Dance; or
 2. Any one Senior Bronze/STAR 6 Free Skating, Skills, Dance or a Juvenile Competitive test; or
 3. Any one higher level test.

Registration Deadline Date: NOON on Wednesday February 10, 2021 (Spots are limited)

There is no registration fee to attend, but candidates should be committed to completing all aspects of the training.

Participants must be presently registered with Skate Canada for the 2020-2021 season to access the Members site and complete a couple of online activities in advance of the seminar. These activities are the STAR 6-Gold Introductory online module – approximate time to complete is 45 minutes to 1 hour (certificate) and the Officials Code of Ethics online learning - approximate time to complete is 45 minutes (certificate).

Upon successful completion of this seminar, candidates will receive In-Training status and then will proceed to complete the various discipline-specific technical online training modules in Freeskate, Skills, Dance and Artistic. Then, candidates will complete co-evaluations to gain experience with assigning the rubric. A Respect in Sport online course is also required as a mandatory training activity. At that point, the candidate qualifies for Trained Evaluator status. The final step on the evaluator pathway involves mentorship and the successful completion of a mentored assessment under the direction of a Qualified Evaluator/Mentor to gain Qualified Evaluator status and then you can begin assessing skaters at assessment days.
