Eligibility to Compete

Competitive Events – Competitors Age as of July 1, 2021:

Pre-Juvenile – Singles U11, U13 / Pair U15 ** / Dance U14
Juvenile – Singles U12, U15 **/ Pair U17 ** / Dance U17 **
Pre-Novice – Singles U16 / Pair U18 / Dance U18
Novice – Singles U17 / Pair No Age / Dance U19 Women /U21 Men
Junior – Singles U19 / Pair No Age / Dance U19 Women /U21 Men
Senior – Singles No Age / Pair No Age / Dance No Age

** For the 2021-2022 season only Skate Canada is extending the upper age for:

- **Pre-Juvenile pairs** – must not have reached the age of 15 before July 1 preceding the event
- **Juvenile singles U14** – must not have reached the age of 15 before July 1 preceding the event
- **Juvenile pairs and ice dance** – must not have reached the age of 17 before July 1 preceding the event

Synchro Events – Competitors Age as of July 1, 2021:

Beginner I – At least 75% of skaters must not have reached the age of 12
Beginner II - Must not have reached the age of 12, at least 75% must not have reached the age of 10
Elementary - Must not have reached the age of 15
Pre-Juvenile – Must not have reached the age of 12
Juvenile – Must not have reached the age of 15, at least 75% must not have reached the age of 13
Pre-Novice – Must have reached the age of 12 but must not have reached the age of 18
Novice - Must have reached the age of 10 but must not have reached the age of 15
Intermediate – For the 2021-2022 season only must not have reached the age of 20
Open - Must have reached the age of 15
Junior - Must have reached the age of 13 but must not have reached the age of 19 ***
Senior - Must have reached the age of 15
Adult SYS Class I - Must have reached the age of 18
Adult SYS Class II - Must have reached the age of 18, at least 75% must have reached the age of 25
Adult SYS Class III - Must have reached the age of 18, at least 75% must have reached the age of 35

Competitive Skaters and STARSkate Competition Event Eligibility Crossover Chart

Registration Details

1. Proof of age may be required to register for events with age restrictions. Competitors in age restricted categories may be required to show proof of age at a competition and should carry their birth certificate with them to each competition.
2. Any skater entered in an age-restricted category, for which they are not qualified, shall be disqualified. The skater will not be permitted to change categories after the designated change cut-off date as indicated in the announcement. Entry fees shall not be refunded after the registration deadline.
3. Registration deadlines shall be set by the host committee and the Technical Representative. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the technical representative in consultation with the host competition chair. There will be a \$100 late entry fee in addition to the regular entry fee if late entries are accepted. The allowance of late entries, and the deadline for late entries if allowed, will be indicated in the announcement.

Warm-Up Times

The following warm-up times are standardized by Skate Canada:

Music Requirements

1. Music Registration

- a. Online music registration will be required for Section Championship events, synchronized skating events, and competitive combined invitationals. Each skater or team shall submit an mp3 file of their program online with their registration and the music time.
- b. Music files will not be kept. Skaters and teams will be required to submit their music for each individual competition.***
- c. Each skater or team will be required to submit a copy of their music on CD when registering onsite as a backup. If there have been changes to the music submitted during registration, 2 CD's must be provided at onsite registration and the registration personnel notified that there is a change. Skaters will not be permitted to register onsite if a CD is not provided.
- d. STARSkate Invitational events will require each skater or team to register 2 CD's of each program at the time of registering on-site at the event.

- e. **Backup music on personal electronic devices or USB Sticks will not be accepted**

2. Labeling

Skaters or Team’s first and last name(s), category name, total music time (not skating time) and home club shall be clearly printed:

- a. Identify the CD by writing on the front of the CD using a permanent marker.
- b. DO NOT write on the recorded side of CD
- c. Label the back of the CD case. Do not apply stick on labels to the CD.

3. Recording Specifications

- a. The only format for online upload of music will be mp3.
- b. Only one program (using one track only) shall be recorded on each CD.
- c. Music shall be recorded on the CD not less than .25 second and not more than .5 second after the play button is pressed on the CD player.

Freeskate Assessments at Competitions

Skaters may apply to take STAR 6 – Gold Freeskate program assessment in competition where it is offered by the organizing committee. Assessments will depend on availability of a qualified evaluator and will be granted on an application basis.

The following chart indicates the applicable competition categories that a skater may attempt a STAR Program assessment during competition. Skaters must enter the appropriate competition Category for assessment.

STAR Assessment	Competition Category for Assessment
STAR 6 Program	STAR 6 Freeskate, Pre-Juvenile Singles Free Program, Juvenile Singles Free Program
STAR 7 Program	STAR 7 Freeskate
STAR 8 Program	STAR 8 Freeskate
STAR 9 Program	STAR 9 Freeskate, Pre-Novice Singles Short Program, Novice Singles Short Program
STAR 10 Program	STAR 10 Freeskate
Gold Program	Gold Freeskate, Novice Singles Free Program

The following age categories apply to Singles Free Skating and Interpretive Events:

Young Adult	18 to 24 years
Class I	25 to 35 years
Class II	36 to 45 years
Class III	46 to 55 years
Class IV	56 years and older

Note that successive age categories may be combined if numbers warrant. Skaters must be notified prior to the competition if age categories are being combined.
