- 1. The Event is being held under the current rules of the Association Official Rulebook. The nature of the Event is defined in the Skate Canada Rule Book > Competitions. The Association reserves the right to alter the overall procedures to be followed during any part of the Event, if such alteration is considered to be in the best interest of the skaters or the Association. The Technical Representative, Chief Referee, or Senior Referee present will be the agent of the Association in such an instance.
- 2. **CATEGORIES:** The following Categories are to be held. All categories will be **ONE** skates unless otherwise stated:

3. **ENTRY FEES:**

- 4. **PRACTICE ICE**: Practice ice may be available for purchase depending on competition schedule. If available, practice ice may be purchased for \$50 per 10-minute block. Teams will be contacted after the schedule is posted if practice ice is available.
- 5. **SCHEDULE OF PRACTICE TIMES AND EVENT SCHEDULE:** Competition & Dressing Room schedules will be posted on the Section website <u>www.skateabnwtnun.ca</u>.

- 6. **ENTRIES**: Entrants in Events shall be:
 - a) Eligible persons as defined in Skate Canada Rule Book > Competitions > 2.1
 - b) Be Associate members in good standing of the Association.

Restriction of Entries – If necessary, entries may be limited to adhere to the Section guidelines for hours of competition. Competition may not begin before 12pm on Friday, may not run more than 12 hours on Saturday, and must be completed by 5pm on Sunday. Approval from the Competition Committee is required to go outside of these restrictions.

Skaters competing on multiple teams do so with the understanding that there may be conflicts that cannot be resolved.

Team Rosters – Team Rosters must be uploaded via the online registration system at the time of registration, including all alternates. Any changes to team rosters must be sent to skateabreg@gmail.com. No changes will be accepted after March 1, 2022.

Confirmation – All information will be posted on the Section website (www.skateabnwtnun.ca).

- 7. <u>CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES</u>: All entries must be received no later than February 4, 2022 at 12:00pm (noon) MT. It is the responsibility of the team to ensure that their entry is submitted through the online registration system by the closing date.
- 8. **LATE ENTRIES**: Late entries will not be accepted.
- 9. **REFUND OF ENTRY FEES:** Entry fees shall be refunded only if the event is not held or if the entry is withdrawn before the date of close of entries. There will be a \$10.00 administration fee applied to all withdrawal refunds. After the closing date of entries (February 4) there will be no refunds given for any reason, including medical pulls. No exceptions.
- 10. **MARKING SYSTEM:** Beginner I, II and Elementary will be judged as per the 2021-2022 Synchronized Skating Assess to Standard Program Requirements Guide. All other events will be judged using the CPC marking system.
- 11. **DRAW:** As per Skate Canada Competitions rule 3.2, the random draw will be used for subsequent starting order draws (where applicable).

12. MUSIC REGISTRATION:

- a) Online music registration will be required. Each team shall submit an mp3 file of their program online with their registration and the music time. Music files will not be kept so skaters and teams will be required to submit their music for each individual competition.
- b) Each team will be required to submit a copy of their music on CD when registering onsite as a backup. Cell phones, iPods, and other personal devices will not be accepted. If there have been changes to the music submitted during registration, 2 CD's must be provided at onsite registration and the registration personnel notified that there is a change. Teams will not be permitted to register onsite if a CD is not provided.

Information regarding the requirements and standards for music are listed in the Section Technical Package as posted on the Section's website: www.skateabnwtnun.ca. Competitors are responsible for the recovery of their own music at the completion of the event.

- 13. ACCIDENTS: The Association and Committee of the Host Club undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by the skater. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in this event, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by, or connected with the conduct and management of the competitions. An agreement must also be deemed to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the Association, the Host Club, and their officers. Entries shall be accepted only in accordance with these conditions.
- 14. <u>ON-SITE REGISTRATION</u>: Skaters must register at least one hour prior to the start of their scheduled category or practice. Music must be turned in at the time of first registration (2 copies of music must be registered). Skaters must report to the Ice Captain one hour prior to their scheduled category.
- 15. **CANCELLATION OF EVENTS:** The host club reserves the right to cancel categories in coordination with the Tech Rep.
- 16. <u>COACH ACCREDITATION</u>: All coaches must be minimally NCCP Regional Coach In Training and carry proof of current membership within the Association and a valid First Aid certificate. Coaches will be required to register at the registration desk.
- 17. **AWARDS:** Details on how medals will be distributed will be provided in the skater/coach welcome letter one week prior to the event.
- 18. <u>PICTURES & VIDEOS:</u> Persons wishing to take photographs of on ice performances are reminded that use of flash cameras is forbidden. The use of video cameras must be restricted to areas that do not hamper the skaters or officials. **NOTE:** You may only take pictures or videos of your own skater/team.
- 19. <a href="PROTEST POLICY: "PROTEST POLICY: "PROTEST POLICY: "PROTEST POLICY: "PROTEST POLICY: "Skate Canada Protest Policy for competitions using CPC will be followed. In addition, if there is an event using manual calculation where the results are not posted within one hour of the completion of the last event of the day, the protest must be made to the Event Referee within the first hour of the following day's competition. If the Event Referee is unavailable, the protest may be made to the Technical Representative or Chief Referee. Protests are to be submitted through the online form on the Section website.
- 20. <u>SPECTATORS/PARENTS:</u> In support of Alberta's healthcare system during the pandemic; **it is strongly** recommended a maximum of (2) spectators/parents per skater attend.
- 21. **SKATE CANADA WAIVER:** All participants (coaches, skaters, officials and volunteers) are required to sign the Skate Canada Waiver for their participation in this event.
- 22. **FACILITY RESTRICTIONS:** The Carstairs Memorial Arena is following the Restriction Exemption Program. For a competition, all persons, age 12 and over, entering the facility will be required to show proof of vaccination, negative test, or medical exemption.

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS:

REGISTRATION CHANGES: After the registration deadline date, changes to entries will only be made by the Technical Representative. Confirm which event to register in with your coach before submitting your registration. No changes will be made after **February 14, 2022**.

<u>PROOF OF AGE:</u> For all categories, age shall be the age of the skater before **July 1, 2021**. You do not have to submit your proof of age document when registering. Please bring the skater's birth certificate to the competition so that it may be produced upon request. If you cannot produce proof of age when requested, the

skater may be withdrawn from the event. It is your responsibility to ensure the skater is entered in the correct category according to Skate Canada's age and test requirements.

<u>PLANNED PROGRAM SHEETS:</u> Planned Program Sheets are required for all categories. There will be a \$20 fee for failing to register Planned Program Sheets by **February 14, 2022 at 12:00pm (noon) MT**. Teams will not be permitted to register at the competition until the late fee has been paid and a Planned Program Sheet has been completed.
