GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. The Event is being held under the current rules of the Association Official Rulebook. The nature of the Event is defined in the Skate Canada Rule Book > Competitions. The Association reserves the right to alter the overall procedures to be followed during any part of the Event, if such alteration is considered to be in the best interest of the skaters or the Association. The Technical Representative, Chief Referee, or Senior Referee present will be the agent of the Association in such an instance.

3. **ENTRY FEES:**

Note: \$5 from every skater fee is paid to the Section to help support the programs and services the Section provides.		

- 4. **ENTRIES**: Entrants in Events shall be:
 - a) Eligible persons as defined in Skate Canada Rule Book > Competitions > 2.1
 - b) Be Skate Canada registrants in good standing.

Restriction of Entries – If necessary, entries may be limited to adhere to the Section guidelines for hours of competition. Competition may not begin before 12pm on Friday, may not run more than 12 hours on Saturday, and must be completed by 5pm on Sunday. Approval from the Competition Committee is required to go outside of these restrictions.

Skaters competing on multiple teams do so with the understanding that there may be conflicts that cannot be resolved.

5. <u>TEAM ROSTERS:</u> Team Rosters must be uploaded via the online registration system at the time of registration, including all alternates. Any changes to team rosters must be sent to skateabreg@gmail.com. No changes will be accepted after February 17, 2023.

Confirmation – All information will be posted on the Section website (www.skateabnwtnun.ca).

- 6. <u>CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES</u>: All entries must be received no later than February 1, 2023, at 12:00pm (noon) MT. It is the responsibility of the team to ensure that their entry is submitted through the online registration system by the closing date.
- 7. **LATE ENTRIES**: No late entries will be accepted.
- 8. <u>REFUND OF ENTRY FEES:</u> Entry fees shall be refunded only if the event is not held or if the entry is withdrawn before the date of close of entries. There will be a \$10.00 administration fee applied to all withdrawal refunds. After the closing date of entries (February 1, 2023) there will be no refunds given for any reason, including medical pulls. No exceptions.
- 9. **MUSIC REGISTRATION:**

Online music registration will be required. Each team shall submit an mp3 file of their program online with their registration and the music time. Music files will not be kept so skaters and teams will be required to submit their music for each individual competition.

Each team will be required to submit a copy of their music on CD when registering onsite as a backup. Cell phones, iPods, and other personal devices will not be accepted. If there have been changes to the music submitted during registration, 2 CD's must be provided at onsite registration and the registration personnel notified that there is a change. Teams will not be permitted to register onsite if a CD is not provided. If your music changed after registration online, you may update your music file through uplifter by March 1 at noon.

Information regarding the requirements and standards for music are listed in the Section Technical Package as posted on the Section's website: www.skateabnwtnun.ca. Competitors are responsible for the recovery of their own music at the completion of the event.

10. <u>COACH ACCREDITATION</u>: All coaches must be minimally NCCP Regional Coach In Training and carry proof of current membership within the Association and a valid First Aid certificate. All Coaches will be required to register at the registration desk. Coaches must wear their event specific accreditation tag to access change rooms and event arena(s). If your name does not appear on the coaches list for the event, coaches must be prepared to show proof of in good standing status prior to receiving accreditation.

Two coaches per entry will be accredited.

11. **TEAM MANAGERS AND CHAPERONES ACCREDITATION:** All team managers and chaperones must be current Skate Canada registrants.

Two coaches, one team manager and two chaperones, for a total of five (5) people per team may be accredited. The names and Skate Canada numbers for these accreditations must be included on the online registration form.

One or two coaches and one alternate (skater) may stand at the entrance to the ice. A second coach (if not at the skater on gate), team manager and other alternates in the exit area (Kiss & Cry). The chaperones will be allowed in the dressing rooms only and will not have access to ice level during practice or competition (including Kiss & Cry).

- 12. **PRACTICE ICE**: No practice ice will be offered.
- 13. **SCHEDULE OF PRACTICE TIMES AND EVENT SCHEDULE:** Competition & Dressing Room schedules will be posted on the Section website www.skateabnwtnun.ca.
- 14. MARKING SYSTEM: Star 3 & 4 will be judged as per the Synchronized Skating Assess to Standard Program Requirements Guide. All other events will be judged using the CPC marking system. STAR 3 is an elements event that is assessed to standard for teams of 6 to 12 skaters. STAR 4 is a program that is assessed to standard with ranking for teams of 8 to 16 skaters. (As Per Skate Canada Notice Board)
- 15. **DRAW:** As per Skate Canada Competitions rule 3.2, the random draw will be used for subsequent starting order draws (where applicable).
- 16. **ON-SITE REGISTRATION**: Specific information regarding the on-site registration process will be sent out to skaters and coaches one week prior to the event.
- 17. **CANCELLATION OF CATEGORIES:** The host club reserves the right to cancel categories in coordination with the Technical Representative.
- 18. **AWARDS:** Ribbons/Medals will be presented off-ice during a flood immediately following the posting of the results. Teams will be provided additional information in the welcome package provided at registration.
- 19. <u>PICTURES & VIDEOS:</u> Persons wishing to take photographs of on ice performances are reminded that use of flash cameras are forbidden. The use of video cameras must be restricted to areas that do not hamper the skaters or officials. **NOTE:** You may only take pictures or videos of your own skater/team.
- 20. **PROTEST POLICY:** Skate Canada Protest Policy for competitions using CPC will be followed. In addition, if there is an event using manual calculation where the results are not posted within one hour of the completion of the last event of the day, the protest must be made to the Event Referee within the first hour of the following day's competition. If the Event Referee is unavailable, the protest may be made to the Technical Representative or Chief Referee. **Protests are to be submitted through the online form on the Section website.**
- 21. ACCIDENTS: The Association and Committee of the Host Club undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by the skater. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in this event, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by, or connected with the conduct and management of the competitions. An agreement must also be deemed to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the Association, the Host Club, and their officers. Entries shall be accepted only in accordance with these

conditions.

22. **LIVE STREAMING/PHOTOGRAPHY**

The event may be photographed and/or live streamed. By virtue of your registration for the competition, you are consenting to being included in the live streaming/photography of this event that will help to train others and to promote skating in Canada. You release Skate Canada: Alberta-NWT/Nunavut, its officers, and employees, and each and all persons involved from any liability connected with the video & audio recordings. By attending and competing at the competition, you waive any right to inspect or approve any video or audio recordings taken by Skate Canada AB I NT I NU.

All video recordings will be archived and posted to the Skate Canada AB I NT I NU Daily Motion website. If you do not wish to have your team photographed or live streamed, inform the Competition Chair of the event. We cannot guarantee that you will not be photographed or live streamed, but we will do our best to accommodate the request.

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

<u>REGISTRATION CHANGES:</u> After the registration deadline date, changes to entries will only be made by the Technical Representative. Confirm which event to register in with your coach before submitting your registration. No changes will be made after <u>February 17, 2023</u>.

PROOF OF AGE: For all categories, age shall be the age of the skater before **July 1, 2022**. You do not have to submit your proof of age document when registering. If you cannot produce proof of age when requested, the skater may be withdrawn from the event. It is your responsibility to ensure the skater is entered in the correct category according to Skate Canada's age and assessment requirements.

PLANNED PROGRAMS: Planned Programs are required for Star 4 and higher.

There will be a \$20 fee for failing to submit the Planned Program(s) by March 1, 2023, at 12:00pm (noon) MT. Planned Program sheets will NOT be accepted onsite at the event.

Planned program sheets must be submitted once per season via Uplifter. Teams may edit or re-submit their planned program in Uplifter if changes are made throughout the 2022-2023 season.
