Eligibility to Compete

Competitive/Podium Pathway Categories – Skaters Age as of July 1, 2023:

Pre-Juvenile - Dance U14

Juvenile - Singles U10, U12, U14 / Pair U16 / Dance U17

Pre-Novice - Singles U16 / Pair U18 / Dance U18

Novice - Singles U17 / Pair No Age / Dance U19 Women /U21 Men

Junior – Singles U19 / Pair No Age / Dance U19 Women /U21 Men

Senior – Singles No Age / Pair No Age / Dance No Age

Star Pathway Categories – Skaters Age as of July 1, 2023:

Star 4 - U10 / U13 / 13&O

Star 5 - U10 / U13 / 13&O

Synchronized Skating Categories – Skaters Age as of July 1, 2023

Star 3 Elements - At least 75% of skaters must not have reached the age of 12

Star 4 - Age grouping may be used only if numbers warrant. Option 1: No age restriction. Option 2: At least 75% of skaters must not have reached the age of 12 as of July 1st preceding the competition. (U12). Option 3: at least 75% of skaters must have reached the age of 12 as of July 1st preceding the competition. (O12)

Star 6 (Juvenile) - Must not have reached the age of 15, at least 75% must not have reached the age of 13

Star 8 (Pre-Novice) – Must not have reached the age of 18

Gold (Intermediate) - Must not have reached the age of 19

Open - Must have reached the age of 15

Novice - Must have reached the age of 10 but must not have reached the age of 16

Junior - Must have reached the age of 13 but must not have reached the age of 19

Senior - Must have reached the age of 16

Adult SYS Class I - Must have reached the age of 18

Adult SYS Class II - Must have reached the age of 18

Adult SYS Class III - Must have reached the age of 18

Adult Skating Categories for Freeskate and Artistic – Skaters Age as of July 1, 2023

Young Adult - 18 to 24 years of age

Class I – 25 to 35 years of age

Class II - 36 to 45 years of age

Class III - 46 to 55 years of age

Class IV - 56 years of age and older

Successive adult age categories may be combined if numbers warrant. Skaters must be notified prior to the competition if age categories are being combined.

Sectionals & Star Pathway Crossover Eligibility Chart

For skaters registered for the 2024 Skate AB I NT I NU Sectional Championships (event takes place Nov 2-5, 2023), the crossover eligibility chart illustrates the categories a skater is permitted to register for at the 2024 Skate AB I NT I NU StarSkate & Adult Championships and the Star Series Competitions & Combined Winter Invitational for the 2023-2024 Season. Registration Details

- Proof of age may be required to register for events with age restrictions. Competitors in age
 restricted categories may be required to show proof of age at a competition and should have proof
 of age with them at each competition.
- Any skater entered in an age-restricted category, for which they are not qualified, shall be disqualified. The skater will not be permitted to change categories after the designated change cut-off date as indicated in the announcement. Entry fees shall not be refunded after the registration deadline.
- 3. Registration deadlines shall be set by the host committee and the Technical Representative. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the technical representative in consultation with the host competition chair. Late entries, if accepted, will be charged a \$100 late entry fee per entry, or 50% of the entry fee (whichever is greater). The allowance of late entries, and the deadline for late entries if allowed, will be indicated in the announcement.

Warm-Up Times

The following warm-up times are standardized by Skate Canada:

All warm-ups will be according to Skate Canada Guidelines: Rules of Sport > Competitions > 3.9. Warm-Up

Music Requirements

1. Music Registration

- a. Online music registration will be required for Section Championship events, Synchronized Skating events, Fall Invitational and Combined Invitationals. Each skater or team shall submit an mp3 file of their program online with their registration.
- b. <u>Music files will not be kept. Skaters and teams will be required to submit their music for each individual competition.</u>
- c. For events not submitting music electronically: Each skater or team will be required to submit a copy of their music on CD or USB when registering onsite as a backup. If there have been changes to the music submitted during registration, 2 CD's or one USB must be provided at onsite registration and the registration personnel notified that there is a change. Skaters will not be permitted to register onsite if their music is not provided.
- Events submitting music electronically with registration: music will not be collected at

registration; however, skaters are required to bring their music rink side when they are competing.

2. Labeling

Skaters or Team's first and last name(s), category name, total music time (not skating time) and home club shall be clearly printed:

- a. Identify the CD/USB by writing on the front of the CD or placing the USB in a Ziploc bag and labelling the bag. Use a permanent marker when labelling.
- b. DO NOT write on the recorded side of CD
- c. Label the back of the CD case. Do not apply stick on labels to the CD.

3. Recording Specifications

- a. The only format for online upload of music will be mp3.
- b. Only one program (using one track only) shall be recorded on each CD. When providing a USB, ensure only the current skating programs for the event you are entering are downloaded onto the USB. Each program must be clearly specified on the USB.
 - For example: John Doe, Pre-Novice Short or Jane Smith, Junior Free
- c. Music shall be recorded on the CD not less than .25 second and not more than .5 second after the play button is pressed on the CD player.

Freeskate Assessments at Competitions

Skaters may apply to take Star 6 – Gold Freeskate program assessment in competition where it is offered by the organizing committee. Assessments will depend on availability of a qualified evaluator and will be granted on an application basis. The following chart indicates the applicable competition categories that a skater may attempt a Star Program assessment during competition. Skaters must enter the appropriate competition category for assessment.
