

ENTRY ELIGIBILITY

ENTRIES: Entrants in Events shall be:

- a) Be Skate Canada registrants in good standing
- b) PROOF OF AGE: For all categories, age shall be the age of the skater before July 1, 2024. You do not have to submit your proof of age document when registering. Please bring the skater's birth certificate to the competition so that it may be produced upon request. If you cannot produce proof of age when requested, the skater may be withdrawn from the event. It is your responsibility to ensure the skater is entered in the correct category according to Skate Canada's age and assessment requirements.
- c) *For Star skaters entering the Team Element Event, this does not count towards your Star Series competition restrictions.
- **d)** Skaters competing on multiple teams do so with the understanding that there may be conflicts that cannot be resolved.

HOW TO REGISTER

- All registrations must be completed using the Uplifter online registration form
- Refer to the How to Register link on the Skate AB/NT/NU registration site for detailed instructions
- All payments must be paid online using a credit card at the time of registration.
- Planned programs must be submitted through Uplifter. See "How to Submit a Planned Program" link on the registration page for assistance in completing your planned program content sheet.

<u>Team Rosters:</u> Team Rosters must be uploaded via the online registration system at the time of registration, including all alternates. Any changes to team rosters must be sent to skateabreg@gmail.com. No changes will be accepted after November 21, 2024.

REGISTRATION DEADLINE DATES

CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES: November 15, 2024, at 12:00pm (noon) MT

All entries must be received no later than **November 15, 2024, 12:00pm (noon) MT.** It is the responsibility of the team to ensure that their entry is submitted by the closing date.

LATE REGISTRATION ENTRIES:

Late entries will not be accepted.

REFUND OF ENTRY FEES:

Entry fees shall be refunded only if the event is not held or if the entry is withdrawn before the date of close of entries. There will be a \$10.00 administration fee applied to all withdrawal refunds. After the closing date of entries there will be no refunds given for any reason, including medical pulls. No exceptions.

REGISTRATION CHANGE DEADLINE: November 21, 2024

After the registration deadline date, changes to entries will only be made by the Technical Representative. Confirm which event to register in with your coach before submitting your registration. No changes will be made after **November 21, 2024**. Registration changes must be submitted by using the online form available on the event page of the website.

REGISTRATION CHANGE FEE

For any changes that are required to be made to a team's registration, there will be a \$25 Registration Change Fee applied to all registration changes.

PLANNED PROGRAMS – HOW TO SUBMIT & DEADLINE

Deadline to submit planned programs: December 4, 2024, at 12:00pm (noon) MT.

Fee charged for not submitting: There is a \$25 fee per entry for failing to submit Planned Program(s) by the deadline date. Planned Program Sheets will NOT be accepted on site.

How to submit planned programs:

- Planned programs must be submitted once per season via Uplifter.
- The first event of the 2024-2025 season is the 2024 Rose Bowl Invitational. All teams (Star 4 & higher) must submit a Planned Program
- Teams may edit or re-submit their planned program in Uplifter if changes are made throughout the 2024-2025 season.

MUSIC REGISTRATION

- Online music registration will require each team to submit an mp3 file of their program music and the music time online at the time of their registration.
- Music files will not be kept so skaters and teams will be required to submit their music for each individual competition.
- USBs only are accepted as music back-up. No CD's. Each team is required to carry a copy of their music on USB and have it available at rink side as backup. A USB may contain all the programs the team is competing in for the competition, however, the programs on the USB must be properly labelled to ensure the correct music is played. For example: Team A, Novice Short Program
- USBs must be provided in a Ziploc bag and labelled with the team name and category.

Deadline to submit changes for your music after submission: December 4, 2024

If there have been changes to the music after submission during the online registration, the updated music file must be uploaded by **December 4, 2024**. New music can be uploaded through your Uplifter account.

Information regarding the requirements and standards for music are listed in the Skate AB/NT/NU Technical Package as posted on the Section's website: www.skateabnwtnun.ca. Competitors are responsible for the recovery of their own music at the completion of the event.

ROSE BOWL DETAILS AND INFORMATION

- 1. <u>EVENT INFORMATION:</u> Event details (such as schedule and arena map) will be posted on the Skate AB I NT I NU website on the Rose Bowl Invitational event page.
- 2. PRACTICE ICE: Practice ice will not be offered.
- **3. ON-SITE REGISTRATION:** Specific information regarding the on-site registration process will be sent out to skaters and coaches one week prior to the event.
- **4. COACH ACCREDITATION**: All coaches must be minimally NCCP Regional Coach In Training and carry proof of current membership within the Association and a valid First Aid certificate. Coaches will be required to register at the registration desk. Coaches must wear their event specific accreditation tag to access change rooms and event arena(s). If your name does not appear on the coaches list for the event, coaches must be prepared to show proof of in good standing status prior to receiving accreditation.

Mandatory Purchase of AB/NT/NU Coach Tag: All coaches attending a competition in the Skate AB I NT I NU Section will be required to purchase an accreditation tag holder and lanyard. This accreditation tag is required for all Skate AB I NT I NU competitions. The tag holder can be purchased on the Section website and must be purchased prior to attending a competition.

5. <u>**TEAM MANAGERS AND CHAPERONES ACCREDITATION:**</u> All Team managers and Chaperones must be current Skate Canada registrants.

Two coaches, one team manager and two chaperones, for a total of five (5) people per team may be accredited. The names and Skate Canada numbers for these accreditations must be included on the online registration form.

One or two coaches and one alternate (skater) may stand at the entrance to the ice. A second coach (if not at the skater on gate), team manager and other alternates in the exit area (Kiss & Cry). The chaperones will be allowed in the dressing rooms only and will not have access to ice level during practice or competition (including Kiss & Cry).

- **6. EVENT SCHEDULE:** Competition and Dressing Room schedules will be posted on the Skate AB/NT/NU website www.skateabnwtnun.ca.
- 7. START ORDERS/RESULTS/SKATE DETAILS: The start order/results/skate details will be posted on the Skate AB/NT/NU website. Results and skate details will NOT be provided on-site at the event, except for Star 3 & 4 skate details. The Star 3 & 4 skate details will be provided onsite and handed out at the registration desk.
- **8.** <u>CANCELLATION OF CATEGORIES:</u> The host club reserves the right to cancel categories in coordination with the Technical Representative.
- 9. MARKING SYSTEM: Star 3 & 4 synchronized skating categories will be judged as per the Synchronized Skating Assess to Standard Program Requirements Guide. All other synchronized skating categories will be judged using the CPC marking system. Star Team Element Events will be judged as per the Star Event Management Guide.
- **10. DRAWS:** As per Skate Canada Competitions rule 3.2, the reverse order will be used for subsequent starting order draws (where applicable).
- **11.** <u>MEDAL PRESENTATIONS:</u> Medals will be presented off-ice during a flood immediately following the posting of the results. Teams will be provided additional information in the welcome package provided at registration.
- 12. PROTEST POLICY: Skate Canada Protest Policy for competitions using CPC will be followed. In addition, if there is an event using manual calculation where the results are not posted within one hour of the completion of the last event of the day, the protest must be made to the Event Referee within the first hour of the following days competition. If the Event Referee is unavailable, the protest may be made to the Technical Representative or Chief Referee. Protests are to be submitted through the online form provided on the Skate AB I NT I NU website.
- 13. <u>CLARIFICATIONS:</u> clarifications regarding a team's report card may be submitted using the online form provided on the Rose Bowl event page of the Skate AB I NT I NU website. <u>Clarifications are to be submitted through the online form provided on the Skate AB I NT I NU website.</u>
- **14. SPECTATORS/PARENTS:** Spectators are permitted. In the event of any restrictions being implemented by the facility, those would be adhered to.
- 15. ACCIDENTS: The Association and Committee of the Host Club take no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by the skater. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in this event, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by, or connected with the conduct and management of the competitions. An agreement must also be deemed to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the Association, the Host Club, and their officers. Entries shall be accepted only in accordance with these conditions.
- **16.** <u>PICTURES & VIDEOS:</u> Persons wishing to take photographs of on-ice performances are reminded that use of flash cameras is not permitted. You may only take pictures or videos of your own skater/team.
- 17. LIVE STREAMING/PHOTOGRAPHY

The event may be photographed and/or live streamed. By virtue of your registration for the competition, you are consenting to being included in the live streaming/photography of this event. You release Skate AB I NT I NU, its officers, and employees, and each and all persons involved from any liability connected with the video & audio recordings. By attending and competing at the competition, you waive any right to inspect or approve any video or audio recordings taken by Skate AB I NT I NU. All video recordings will be archived and posted to the Skate AB I NT I NU Daily Motion website. If you do not wish to have your skate photographed or live streamed, inform the Competition Chair of the event. We cannot guarantee that you will not be photographed or live streamed, but we will do our best to accommodate the request.
