GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE

The GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE provides governance leadership and the following responsibilities were completed this year: appointment of the Nominating Sub-Committee Chair and Members, development and review of policies, recommendations for amendments to Section bylaws, semi-annual review of Complaints and Membership Support data, review of the Board Evaluation process and procedure, and Board Orientation. Equity Diversity Inclusiveness (EDI) education was also provided to the Board Directors with a focus on the Sport for Life Truth E-Learning indigenous Culture Training — Truth and Reconciliation Edition this year. This Committee also advises the Executive Director in governance matters and provides support in human resource issues through the Executive Director Review and Advisory Sub-Committee.

The **NOMINATING SUB-COMMITTEE** is responsible to the Governance Committee. The purpose of the committee is to ensure that each year the Section has access to a diverse and qualified group of individuals for the Board and Committees to ensure the continued success and stability of the Section. This committee is responsible for overseeing the election processes for Board Director elections while also providing a supporting role to the eight Region Committees in their elections, ensuring each Region has access to qualified volunteers. During the 2022-2023 season the committee focused its efforts on the following: updating election policies and procedures, managing the intake process for discussion and recruitment of interested candidates, and ensuring Board or Committee Candidates receive thorough and timely communication.

The EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REVIEW AND ADVISORY SUB-COMMITTEE is responsible to the Governance Committee. This Sub-Committee leads the process to determine annual objectives for the Executive Director and to conduct the mid-year and annual performance reviews of the Executive Director. This committee also provides oversight for the Section's Human Resources policies and processes and support to the Executive Director in human resources issues.

FINANCE AND RISK MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The **FINANCE AND RISK MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE** is responsible for guiding the Board as it delivers on its fiduciary responsibilities to its members.

This season saw the committee continue to monitor the Section's Risk Register, incorporating input from all Board and Operating Committees. The committee also continued to monitor the Section's long term investments to ensure that the investments are managed in alignment with the Section's goals and objectives. Various finance related policies were reviewed and updated throughout the year. The committee worked with the Section Office to ensure meaningful, timely financial reporting was presented to the Board as well as assisted with grant and regulatory filings as required. As approved by the membership at the 2022 Section AGM, the Section moved forward with a review of our auditing services utilizing a Request For Proposal (RFP) process, resulting in a new firm Coyle & Co performing the audit for the 2022-2023 Section financial statements.

MEMBERSHIP RELATIONS COMMITTEE

The Section's **MEMBERSHIP RELATIONS COMMITTEE** recruits Section Board and non-Board Members with experience in Club Management, Coaching, Officiating, Volunteering and their purpose is to ensure Section members receive value from the Section. They also act as the connection between the members and Board of Directors by obtaining feedback from membership, identifying strategic opportunities for developing the membership while ensuring a safe and welcoming environment for all. The Committee also ensures members are recognized for their contributions and achievements through the Section Awards and Section Hall of Fame programs.

The Key Initiatives for 2022-2023 were to:

- Redesign the Membership Survey to build an experience that is relevant to all stakeholders, regardless of level of interaction with the Section while securing reliable and quantifiable data
- Analyze and communicate Survey findings to Board and Operational Committee Leads to inform future initiatives
- Create a Volunteer Screening Policy and determine supporting procedures
- Review & Update the Dispute Resolution Policy and Procedure to align with changes made at Skate Canada
- Create a Club Application Appeal Process that aligns with the National Service Centre
- Oversee the Skate Canada Achievement Awards and the Skate AB NT NU Awards Program
- Oversee the Skate AB NT NU Hall of Fame Process and Nominations

Membership Survey

The 2022 Membership Survey was sent out in mid-February 2023 to allow for the survey to be open longer than in past years. As intended, the redevelopment of the Membership Survey resulted in a broader respondent base with the primary affiliation type being parent/guardian represented by 54.3% of respondents. This had a significant impact on the year over year trend analysis as 69% of respondents were familiar with the Section's support as opposed to prior years when familiarity with Section was much higher. Significant information was gathered in the survey regarding preference for communication. While email communication remains the highest preference (92.5%), continuing to build on additional information and resources on the Section Website in an opportunity that will remain a focus throughout the 2023-2024 season.

Skate AB | NT | NU Awards and Hall of Fame Programs

While the 2023 Awards Program and Hall of Fame were advertised during a very busy time of year, we received record responses. The Section received 211 nominations, the Section awarded 42 region awards and 13 Section Awards, including Bursaries, Scholarships and Endowment Fund awards totalling \$10,425. The Section Hall of Fame program continues to recognize the many impressive individuals who have made a long-lasting impact on the sport of figure skating in our Section. Inductee Categories include: Athlete, Official, Professional, and Builder. The 2023 Hall of Fame inductees and Section Award Recipients will be celebrated at the 2023 Skate AB | NT Awards Banquet. Past inductees can be found on the Section Website in the virtual Hall of Fame.

Membership Statistics

Both Skate Canada and Skate AB|NT|NU experienced record growth in the 2022-2023 season, with Section Registrants increasing by 21% Year over Year. Skate AB|NT|NU growth was consistent with the National Skate Canada registrants across most categories, most notably outpacing National growth significantly in PowerSkate which saw a 40% increase from the prior year. The largest increase in the number of registrants was in CanSkate programming with an additional 5,723 registrants or growth of 31% in the 2022-2023 Season. This growth was consistent across Canada with National year over year growth of 32%.

The Section also experienced significant increase in Star Pathway programming, which most significantly impacts Section events. With growth of 21%, or an additional 726 Skaters, the Section started a review of the current Competition Structure and Event Calendar and changes necessary to accommodate the growth of the grassroots figure skating program moving forward. This year we welcomed the first application and approval of an indigenous club in the Section with the formation of the Maskekosihk Skating Club, located on the Enoch Cree First Nation in the Edmonton Region. We also welcomed the approval of the Bentley Figure Skating Club in the Central Region this past season.

Coaching Initiatives:

- * Star 6-Gold Coach Assessor in Skills—52 Coaches in our Section can now assess Star 6-Gold Skills. 13 of those coaches have become Mentors to help other coaches who wish to receive the Star 6-Gold Coach Assessor in Skills designation.
- Virtual Coach Apprenticeship Programs—Facilitated by Section Technical Specialists Devan Nychka, Robin Forsyth and Dallas Daniel, 10 coaches were selected for the Virtual Coach Apprenticeship offered this season. 1 session was offered for Regional and Provincial level coaches, with content specifically targeting those coaching levels. The Apprenticeships were created to supplement the coaches technical knowledge and gain insight on how a Technical Panel calls skater's elements.
- * National Coach Apprenticeship Program—15 coaches were selected to attend the National Coach Apprenticeship Program at the Novice Canadian Championships. Facilitated by Cynthia Ullmark. The apprenticeship covered topics such as Program Components, Long Term Development (LTD), the Rule of Two and included performance observations with special guests.
- * Aboriginal Coaching Module—5 Section coaches attended an Aboriginal Coaching educational opportunity held in partnership with the Indigenous Sport Council of Alberta. The module was designed to motivate, inspire and lead Indigenous people in sport, recreation and physical activity.
- * CanSkate Coach/Program Assistant Workshops—Facilitated by Leona Boyle and Tammy Greidanus
 Okotoks—35 Participants Vegreville—12 Participants Slave Lake 9 Participants



As the **OFFICIALS COMMITTEE (OC)** embarked on the first complete season that saw all Section events return to live skating and officiating, we were faced with a significant change to the Program Component structure for judges that was announced at the end of June with just over one month to prepare for our first event of the 2022-2023 season. Officials came together to review over 12 hours of video learnings from the ISU and Skate Canada as well as a dual in-person/virtual learning session conducted at Wild Rose that included members of the coaching community.

Skate Canada provided two in-person learning sessions that took place in October prior to the Sectional Championships that focused on the new 3 Program Component structure. These education sessions helped to prepare our officials to best serve athletes, coaches, and other stakeholders at our qualifying Championship event and other events of the season.

The total number of officials has been on a declining trend across Canada with a 22% drop in Skate AB I NT I NU from 2021-2022 (14% drop in BC/YK who we often share officials with, and a 9% overall drop across Canada). This trend combined with the overall increase of 7% in StarSkate & Podium Pathway registrants, and the hosting of additional Multisport, National and World events this past season made it more challenging to staff events in an environment that was already lacking in official's capacity. Through the extraordinary efforts of many officials and others working behind the scenes, what seemed like the impossible was achieved and skaters were able to participate in the events calendar as posted.

We are looking forward to a year of beginning to build capacity amongst officials in all areas and disciplines. We are excited to train new officials and facilitate growth of existing officials to new promotions through clinics, practical experience, and mentoring. This gradual and steady plan will deepen the pool of officials and allow for succession planning.

Recruitment

The OC continued with social media recruitment campaign, which this year helped attract new Data Specialists which are greatly needed to support our competition calendar. The system developed by Devan Nychka for Tech Panel training in the past was replicated for Data Specialists, Judge and Evaluator recruitment. This was a huge success with 8 new DS recruits ready to begin training by August 2022. As well, reaching out to skaters that are interested in officiating was a priority and proved successful by introducing them through DIO/VRO training at events and virtually throughout the season. We plan to continue these efforts into next season with multiple spring 2023 training clinics already in the works.

Promotions

24 officials achieved 27 promotions this season between April 1, 2022 – March 31, 2023. Congratulations to all who dedicated time and effort into promotion goals!

REGIONS

The **REGIONS COMMITTEE** kicked off the 2022-2023 Season in early June of 2022 with a strategy focused session, and an updated Calendar of Events as well as transitioned to a new Section Staff member as the committee lead.

The Regions Committee has five key responsibilities:

- Assist the Section office with collecting Club and Skating School Directory contact information
- Execution of the Annual Club and Skating School Health & Wellness Survey
- Coordinate Region Committee Meetings during the year
- · Monitor and recommend changes to the Club and Skating School In Good Standing Policy
- Identifying opportunities and developing materials for training and resources to support Clubs and Skating School operations in the Section

The Club and Skating School Health & Wellness Survey was originally created and launched in 2021, to evaluate key indicators of Club and School stability coming out of the pandemic. The data collected provided valuable information into what resources or additional support from the Section would assist them in their operations, but also collected data that has been used in advocacy efforts or for monitoring trends in areas such as volunteer engagement, coaching capacity, and club/school programs being offered. As a result, it was decided to continue with the survey again, and based on the results collected the following Strategic Initiatives were undertaken by the Region Committee this year with new resources and tools starting to be available to clubs and skating schools in the upcoming new season:

- Club and School Templates, Tools & Governance Resources
- Volunteer Engagement
- Fundraising Opportunities
- CanSkate transitions to Star Programming

Safe Sport continues to become more prominent, along with much higher expectations being put onto organizations that are involved in any type of sports programming. It is expected that organizations ensure there is a safe, positive and inclusive environment for anyone who is participating whether that be an athlete, coach, official or volunteer. To ensure the Section is also doing our part, emphasis this year was put into ensuring that Club Board and Skating School Directors have completed the Respect in Sport for Activity Leaders course as we feel education is an important part of prevention of maltreatment and the promotion of safe sport.

PROMOTING A SAFE ENVIRONMENT

Our policies and procedures foster an environment where respect and crust can live on and off the ice. We support and encourage our skating community to explore their passion for the ice, safely.



REGIONS

The **2022-2023 season** brought a return to full programming including: Assessment Days, Competitions, Seminars, Ice Shows and Carnivals, Star 1-3 and CanSkate element events.

This year our Section athletes proudly participated in 128 Club-based events including: 97 carnivals and ice shows and 18 CanSkate Element events and 13 Star 1-3 club events. Club-based events are up 36% over last season, surpassing Pre-COVID numbers, and almost matching the Section's record high Club Events on record.

Many of these activities are supported by the volunteers on the Local Region Committees and the Section Regions Committee. We encourage you to get involved in your Region and contribute to the many amazing initiatives Section athletes and volunteers experience.







CANSKATE@SCHOOL



CanSkate @School In partnership with the Edmonton Oilers Community Foundation Group, the City of Edmonton and Ever Active Schools, the Section again provided CanSkate lessons to inner-city schools. It was the first time on ice for the majority of skaters. The project has been inclusive to include full classes of Grades 1-3 children with behavioral and physical challenges. The project was extended to a group of Grade 6-9 students as well. The response from students and teachers alike has been overwhelmingly positive. The total number of students participating in the CanSkate@School program this season is 993 from 14 different schools! Ten enthusiastic Skate Canada coaches taught the students with Leona Boyle coordinating the program.








COMPETITIONS

The Competition Committee maintained a key focus on the organization and support of all competitions, and to provide consistency for the execution of all competitions. The Committee continues to prioritize our athletes and focus on competitions that can best deliver meaningful experience and competition to those athletes.

The 2023-2024 Event Calendar and competition structure were key priorities for the Committee this year as it was determined that our current structure and calendar were no longer sustainable. A full review was completed, focusing on the following key outcomes:

- Ensure the calendar is in alignment with the new Skate Canada Long Term Development (LTD) framework & updated Skate
 Canada competition calendar,
- Determine the best geographical placement of events
- Ensure our volunteer /officials capacity can support the competition calendar
- Ensure the restructured competition calendar supports the development of Skate AB I NT I NU registrants in both the Star and Podium Pathways







The Section was proud to deliver a full in-person event calendar for the first time since 2019. All events were successful thanks to the hard work of the dedicated Local Organizing Committees and support of the Section.

The Section was also extremely proud to have been selected to host the following National and International Events:

EVENT TECHNICIANS

The **EVENT TECHNICIAN AND EQUIPMENT COMMITTEE** (ETEC) brings together dedicated volunteers in the positions of Music Technicians, Announcers, Camera Operators, and V-mix Live Stream Operators.

With an extremely busy competition calendar for the 2022-2023 season, ETEC had a continued emphasis on recruitment and training and was also focused on reviewing the best practices which are implemented for each position, to ensure that communication is strong amongst the ETEC team to support one another during competitions.

ETEC recruited two Music Tech's, one Camera Operator and one Announcer this season. The goal is to recruit in each Region of the Section to provide support to competitions locally.

The 2022-2023 season was a very busy season for **ATHLETE DEVELOPMENT** as the sport embraced the new Skate Canada competition calendar. The calendar added layers of preparation as we adjusted to two Challenges, Synchronized skating having two National events and the continuation of Novices at their own Championship. In addition, Alberta- Wood Buffalo hosted the 2023 Arctic Winter Games, and we sent a team to the 2023 Canada Winter Games.

Athletes were monitored, assessed, and selected for a variety of opportunities. We enjoyed and are proud of the successes of all our athletes and celebrated the culmination of Keegan Messing's career winning his second Canadian title.

Synchronized Skating

- Support was provided to the coordinators, and financial assistance was provided to 16 participants of the One Team Mvmt Camp held in Calgary in July 2022.
- Development Camp was hosted in October 2022 with over 90 skaters and coaches attending. The lead facilitator was Marilyn Langlois from (World Champion) Les Supremes, with many other experts leading off-ice sessions for a full day of synchro development opportunities.
- Video Monitoring program was offered to all teams free of charge for a 2-month period from October to December 2022. 18 teams participated.
- In-person monitoring was provided to the Junior team prior to departure for the Canadian Championships in January 2023.
- Support was provided to Solstice Junior at the Canadian Tire National Skating Championships, as well as the 3 Section teams who participated in the Skate Canada Cup in February 2023.
- Solstice Junior team was invited to perform at the ISU World Junior
 Figure Skating Championships opening ceremonies in Calgary February 2023.



AdultSkate

- AdultSkate workshops were held in April 2022 (Canmore 27 registrants) and November 2022 (Leduc – 17 registrants) with Kaetlyn Osmond as the featured presenter.
- Support is ongoing for various activities including (but not limited to) communications for AdultSkate opportunities within our Section like the 'Theatre on Ice Workshops'.

Special Olympics

- 12 athletes competed at the Special Olympics Alberta Winter Games in February 2023 in Strathcona County.
- JC Coutts and William Cave represented Alberta at the Canada Winter Games in PEI in February 2023 where they each won a bronze medal. William also attended the staging day for Team AB in January in Edmonton.

Athlete Monitoring

Monitoring returned to prior years activities through the 2022-2023 season at events, through club visitations and via zoom. Our Section Officials make themselves available whenever possible to provide feedback to our Section skaters as they work towards their personal goals. Assistance from these Officials is very appreciated by the Section and all of the stakeholders involved. Monitoring at the Fall competition and following days was conducted by the Technical Director and guest official Sally Rehorick in preparation for Challenge, and Canada Winter Games.

Spring Development Camp

The Spring Development Camp was held April 23-24, 2023 at the Winsport Arena in Calgary after two years of the camp being cancelled due to the pandemic. Brian Orser and Tracy Wilson were the lead facilitators and were assisted by Scott Davis and Jeff Langdon. 140 skaters and coaches from the Section Select and Junior Development teams were in attendance. It was a busy weekend with many activities and a great learning opportunity for all participants.

Off-ice activities included a one-hour talk with Brian and Tracy for skaters and coaches; Parent Session with Dr. Matt Brown who addressed themes around the 'return to normalcy', and the associated emotions for both athletes and parents; Dance and Body Movement led by Diana Lefebvre and Carlotta Edwards; Ballroom Dance instruction led by Martin Lefebvre.

Section Officials Lynne Dey, Robin Forsyth and Leslie Lawrence led educational sessions pertaining to Component, GOE and Technical Scoring.





Athlete Funding

The Athlete Funding Program continues to support Section athletes who have competed in all disciplines at the Challenge, National and International Level, and the athlete funding program guidelines are reviewed annually and posted on the Section Website. 121 Athlete Funding Program awards were distributed during the 2022-2023 season.

Jump Scholarship Program

The Jump Scholarship Program awarded \$3,425 to 17 skaters for jumps accomplished as per the guidelines for the 2022-2023 season. The following age categories earned awards: U11, U14, U16, and U19.

Multisport Games

Planning has begun for the 2024 Alberta Winter Games scheduled for February 16-19, 2024, in Grande Prairie. The philosophy of the Games has been updated to align with the Canada Winter Games categories which only includes Pre-Novice. Unfortunately, this now eliminates the Novice Category from the Alberta Winter Games and eligible categories are focused on building towards a Pre-Novice level athlete.

The Section applied to have a Juvenile Male category included and we were not successful with our request. Representation across all Zones is required to have a category instituted, and the Male representation in our Section does not meet those requirements.

The 2023 Arctic Winter Games were held January 29 - February 4, 2023, in the district of Wood Buffalo, Alberta. The Arctic Games are a unique sporting event designed for Northern athletes with traditional sports and Aboriginal sports combined. Thirty-three skaters from AB North and 17 skaters from NT competed for qualification in Edmonton December 3-5, 2022, followed by selected skaters from Team AB North and NT gathering for an information sharing day. Team AB North sent 8 figure skating athletes and Team NT sent 7 athletes.

The 2023 Games were considered a make up Games due to the 2022 Games being cancelled and planning has started for the regularly scheduled 2024 Arctic Winter Games March 10-16, 2024, in Mat-Su Valley, Alaska


