MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

Dear Skate Alberta, Northwest Territories and Nunavut Community,

As we reflect on the past year, I am proud to share that our theme for our 2024-2025 AGM, is "Success through Synergy: Transforming Together for Tomorrow". This truly embodies the spirit of our Section and the incredible accomplishments we collectively achieved this past year through hard work, collaboration, teamwork as well as our shared vision for the future.

With 30,000 registrants, a record for the Section this past season, we advanced many of the initiatives in the 2022-2026 Strategy under the areas of focus for Skating for Everyone, Skating for Life and Skating to Win.

In addition to the regular competition schedule, we hosted the International Adult Figure Skating Competition in September at Tsuut'ina's Seven Chiefs Sportsplex and Jim Starlight Centre. This celebrated a milestone as Skate Canada's first competition held on First Nation land where we welcomed almost 250 skaters from 14 countries. A few weeks later, a successful Fall Competition in Airdrie returned to the Section. In early February, the Section hosted Skate Canada's Trophy in Edmonton with our up-and-coming pre-novice and novice skaters making us proud with outstanding performances.

Many of our skaters and teams represented our Section both nationally and internationally with many moving performances and personal bests that delighted the officials and the audiences, bringing home 12 medals. Lia Cho had another record-breaking season being crowned the Junior Women Canadian Champion. Black Gold Senior Synchronized Skating team also made an inspiring debut at Nationals, which was the first time the Section had a Senior team competing at Nationals in many decades.

The Special Olympics World Winter Games provided a memorable experience for Alberta skater, Moriah Van't Land, as she travelled away from home, shared in the team experience and brought home a silver medal.

Under Operational Excellence, with our growing registrants, the year closed off with the Section in strong financial position. In addition to extending our programs to support Skating for Life, Skating for Everyone and Skating to Win, funding will support the vision for the Section's organizational restructure, which is a foundational step in transforming our community for the future. In our stakeholder engagement sessions, we heard we needed to modernize and build capacity in our operations, allowing the Section to better serve and support volunteers, skaters, officials and coaches, and position ourselves for sustainable growth. It is through this collective effort that we are shaping a brighter tomorrow for skating in our Section.

This year, we celebrated many significant milestones including the Skate AB|NT|NU Hall of Fame inductions of our 1986 Senior Precision (Synchronized) Skating Team, Sue Cutmore, Coach (posthumous), and Pam Chen in the Builder category. These inductions highlight the rich history, dedication and enduring legacy of this growing discipline in our sport, which we believe, with a collective effort, can continue to attract and retain more athletes — making skating more accessible for anyone who wants to participate.

This year also marks a historic milestone as the Alberta Figure Skating Foundation celebrates 50 years of dedication and service (1975–2025). Their commitment has been instrumental, and we are grateful for their contribution in nurturing talent, supporting athletes, and promoting the sport for many years.

Our committees, volunteers, officials, coaches, clubs and skating schools exemplify this through their collaboration on events, sharing of knowledge and resources, and mutual support to continually improve the Section. BOARD OF DIRECTORS' COMMITTEES

The **GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE** provides governance leadership and responsibilities annually including the appointment of the Nominating Sub-Committee Chair and Members, development and review of policies, review of the Section bylaws, semi-annual review of Complaints and Membership Support data, review of the Board Evaluation process and procedure, and Board Orientation. This Committee also advises the Executive Director in governance matters and provides support in human resource issues through the Executive Director Review and Advisory Sub-Committee.

The **NOMINATING SUB-COMMITTEE** is responsible to the Governance Committee. The purpose of the committee is to ensure that each year the Section has access to a diverse and qualified group of individuals for the Board and Committees to ensure the continued success and stability of the Section. This committee is responsible for overseeing the election processes for Board Director elections while also providing a supporting role to the eight Region Committees in their elections, ensuring each Region has access to qualified volunteers. During the 2024-2025 season the committee focused its efforts on managing the intake process for discussion and recruitment of interested candidates, and ensuring Board or Committee Candidates receive thorough and timely communication.

The **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REVIEW AND ADVISORY SUB-COMMITTEE** is responsible to the Governance Committee. This Sub-Committee leads the process to determine annual objectives for the Executive Director and to conduct the mid-year and annual performance reviews of the Executive Director. This committee also provides oversight for the Section's Human Resources policies and processes and support to the Executive Director in human resource issues.

The **FINANCE AND RISK MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE** is responsible for guiding the Board as it delivers on its fiduciary responsibilities to its members. This includes monitoring the Section's long term investments to ensure that the investments are managed in alignment with the Section's goals and objectives, review and updating, and ensuring meaningful, timely financial reporting is presented to the Board.

The **AD HOC STRATEGY COMMITTEE** was created for the 2023-2024 season to oversee the completion and delivery of the Skate AB|NT|NU strategic plan. The committee provided support to the Executive Director in the development of the plan, and the addition and implementation of a dashboard to measure and report our progress. Strategic planning for the next quadrennial (2026-2030) is already underway with a target launch date of June 2026.

MEMBERSHIP RELATIONS COMMITTEE

The Membership Relations Committee is a standing committee of the Skate AB|NT|NU Section Board. It provides oversight and guidance on the support and services delivered to Skate Canada registrants through Clubs and Skating Schools across the Section.

The Committee is composed of Board and non-Board members representing a diverse range of stakeholders from across the Section. Its work is aligned with the Section's strategic priority of Building Organizational Excellence.

In the 2024–2025 season, the Committee focused on the following initiatives:

New Club Applications and Club Status Review

One new club was approved in the Central Region: Eckville FSC, which resumed operations after a multi-year hiatus.

2025 Skate AB|NT|NU Awards Program

- 238 nominations were received from all 8 Regions, representing all award categories.
- 63 award recipients were recognized at the Section Awards Banquet, alongside their families, friends, and club representatives.

2025 Skate AB | NT | NU Hall of Fame

- Inductions were made in three categories, including the first-ever, Synchronized (Precision) Skating Team.
- Honorees included 28 team members, one coach, and one team manager.

2025 Membership Survey

- Conducted from March 27 to April 25, 2025 with 289 responses received.
- Respondents included Club Administrators, Volunteers Coaches, Guardians, Officials, Section Volunteers and Skaters.
- The average overall satisfaction rating as a member of Skate AB|NT|NU was 3.9 out of 5.0.

Policy and Procedure Oversight

- The Committee maintained oversight of key membership-related policies and procedures, including:
 - General Dispute Reporting and Resolution
 - Volunteer and Employee Screening
 - New Club Application Processes
 - Member Privacy Policy

Rural Club Support

- A dedicated working group composed of rural club representatives collaborated with Section staff to identify and prioritize alternative program delivery models to enhance sustainability and success in rural communities.
- Each season, the group will focus on top-priority initiatives that aim to create meaningful community impact through collaboration.

Review of the Awards Program

- A comprehensive review of the Section's Awards Program was conducted to identify best practices and explore enhanced recognition strategies throughout the season.
- Recommendations for a revised and modernized Awards Program will be implemented for the 2025– 2026 season.

MEMBERSHIP RELATIONS COMMITTEE

The Membership Relations Committee reviews and tracks quarterly registrant statistics throughout the season. The data is used to measure the Section's goals and objectives within the strategic plan.

The 2024-2025 season saw 30,231 registrants, marking the third consecutive year that the Section has achieved the highest change to a record number of registrants. Measuring the number of assessments completed during the season assists in tracking retention or progression of skaters from Active Start through Active for Life stages of the LTD framework. This season along with an increase in the number of registrants, the Section continued to see the number of skater assessments increase to over 13,000. This is a 25% increase from the start of the quadrennial indicating continual growth, retention, and progression of skaters in our Section. Some program affiliations have declined slightly, and the Section will continue to focus our efforts for improvement in those areas. There is continued growth in the areas of CanSkate, StarSkate, Coaches, Officials, Club Board members, and Synchronized Skating Teams.

REGIONS COMMITTEE

The Regions Committee is composed of eight elected Region Representatives, each representing one of the Section's Regions. These representatives are typically involved in club operations and provide valuable insight and advice on initiatives led by the Section Office. Their primary objective is to enhance the experience of club volunteers by offering tools and information that support Skate Canada's minimum operating requirements.

Region Representatives work collaboratively to support the Section's strategic priorities of Organizational Excellence and Skating for Everyone.

2024-2025 Key Initiatives:

2025 Club and School Health and Wellness Survey

Offered early in the season, this survey is completed by nearly 100% of clubs across the Section. It gathers data on club successes, challenges, governance updates, program feedback, and levels of engagement with the Section. This information is aggregated and shared with all relevant committees to inform their planning and decision-making. Results are also presented to each Region, enabling clubs to benchmark their performance, engagement, and success relative to others.

Club Board Member Certification: Respect in Sport for Activity Leaders

Approximately 815 Skate AB|NT|NU club board members currently hold certifications in Respect in Sport for Activity Leaders. This initiative reinforces the creation of safe and welcoming environments for skaters, families, and volunteers. It also ensures greater alignment between coaches and board members on key policies and initiatives.

Fall and Spring Local Region Committee Meetings

Region Representatives coordinate two meetings annually—held consistently across the Section but tailored to the unique needs of each Region. These meetings provide updates on Section and Skate Canada initiatives, celebrate regional successes, and offer clubs an opportunity to collaborate and provide feedback. With over 50% club participation, these meetings serve as valuable forums for idea-sharing, problem-solving, and regional coordination.

Program Delivery Standards Workshops

Two workshops were hosted in preparation for the 2025-2026 season, with over 220 club board members, administrators, and coaches in attendance. Facilitated by Skate Canada, the sessions reviewed the minimum standards required for each Skate Canada program, supporting clubs in delivering high-quality programming.

CanSkate Kits in support of Program Delivery Standards

Free CanSkate kits were distributed to the majority of the Section's Clubs and Skating Schools with funding provided by the Section. The kits provided essential tools to help Clubs/Schools meet Skate Canada's minimum delivery standards. Among Clubs/Schools that implemented the kits, 91% reported a positive impact on their ability to meet standards, 88% noted improvements to program delivery, and 78% observed increased enthusiasm from both coaches and skaters. A limited number of kits remain available for Clubs/Schools that did not respond last season or wish to request an additional kit.

2025 Skate AB | NT | NU Awards Program

Members of the eight Local Region Committees play a vital role in the annual Awards Program. Committee members dedicate time to reviewing region nominations, collaborating with their peers, independently scoring and selecting finalists across all seven Achievement Award categories. With deep experience across Skate Canada programs and stakeholder groups, these volunteers are instrumental in ensuring the awards program recognizes outstanding contributions within the Section.



REGISTERED COACHES

This 2024-2025 season has again been centered around capacity building for officials. With the total number of officials on a declining trend over the past few seasons, the Committee felt it was important to focus on sending officials to participate in the Learning Facilitator training for all the new judge pathways being rolled out as well as including candidates to be trained where possible.

There was lots of focus on the Dance discipline for the Judges this season. In conjunction with Skate Canada Trophy, a Dance education session was held facilitated by Hilary Quick of the BC/YT Section in person at the event. This was prefaced with several virtual sessions hosted by Ethan Swinburnson and Hilary Quick leading up to Skate Canada Trophy. Five of our Section officials attended this opportunity. Learning Facilitator candidates were selected to participate in the roll out of the new Dance and Singles pathways this summer.

The Data Specialist (DS) team started the season with an Introductory DS session in conjunction with Wild Rose event setting them up for promotion by season's end. Skate Canada has been continuing to work on the development of new CSS and our DS team participated in several beta testing opportunities including at Star Series 3 and the StarSkate & Adult Championships where Skate Canada staff were onsite. Further training and development are in the plans for next year.

The Technical Panel team was focused on the roll-out of the new BLTO pathway. Two Learning Facilitators participated in the initial training along with one candidate. She received a Phase 1 promotion and is well on the way to a Phase 2. We also took the opportunity with Skate Canada Trophy being held in Edmonton to have six officials act as DIO/VRO for the event. This gave the participants exposure to panel process at a National level. A pre-event virtual session was held for all to provide them with key information about deportment and process.

Synchronized Skating saw many virtual training sessions conducted throughout the year including update sessions for officials and coaches and practice sessions for both judges and technical. As the Synchro pathway is also rolling out, one Learning Facilitator and candidate were sent to participate in that training. A candidate also attended the Technical training in role of Technical Controller and one participant in the Technical Development program at Skate Canada Cup.

CANSKATE@SCHOOL

In partnership with the Edmonton Oilers Community Foundation Group, the City of Edmonton and Ever Active Schools, the Section again provided CanSkate lessons to inner-city schools. It was the first time on ice for the majority of skaters. The project has been inclusive to include full classes of Grades 1-8 children with behavioral and physical challenges. The response from students and teachers alike continues to be overwhelmingly positive. The total number of students participating in the CanSkate@School program this season is 1170 from 22 different schools! Sixteen enthusiastic Skate Canada coaches taught the students with Leona Boyle coordinating the program. A total of 7098 students have participated since the start of the program in January 2018.















EVENT TECHNICIANS



The Event Technician and Equipment Committee (ETEC) brings together dedicated volunteers in the positions of Music Technicians, Announcers, Camera Operators, and V-mix Live Stream Operators to assist in the recruitment and training of event technicians and provide input on music and livestream equipment maintenance and upgrades.

As a key initiative of Building Organizational Excellence ETEC had a continued emphasis on investing in the recruitment, development and training of Event Technicians. The committee was also focused on reviewing the best practices which are implemented for each position, to ensure that communication is strong amongst the ETEC team to support one another during competitions.

Supporting the Skating for Life area of focus, opportunities to continue to experience the joy of skating through becoming involved in new roles such as an event technician. This season, the ETEC recruited and trained: one Announcer, one Music Technician, two Vmix Live Stream Operators and two Camera Operators.



COMPETITIONS

In a follow-up to the 2023-2024 Competition restructuring, the Competition Committee made some adjustments to the restructuring format for the 2024-2025 season based on feedback received. The feedback was positive overall, providing the committee with a solid foundation in which to continue supporting Skate AB|NT|NU Podium Pathway and Star athletes, while keeping in line with the Skate Canada LTD framework and maintaining a manageable competition calendar for Section officials and volunteers.

The 2024-2025 season saw the introduction of the Solo Dance category to both Star and Podium pathways. The excitement of the addition led to Solo Dance becoming a qualifying category for the StarSkate Championship with 15 qualified entries over 3 categories. The Competition Committee expects this category to continue to grow in the coming seasons.

This season saw a decrease in the number of events with skaters being placed on a waitlist, while also showing an increase in registration numbers at other events that had not reached capacity the previous season. StarSkaters continued to look forward to the StarSkate & Adult Championships qualification process and earning their place in the Championships. This season saw 860 entries within 21 categories for Star men and women singles; artistic and solo dance categories compete at Star Series 1-4 and the Star Territorials with 485 skaters qualify to attend the Championships.

The Leading Edge Series made its return to the competition calendar with a new, exciting format. Highlighting the skater's success over the course of the season, 10 new Leading Edge Champions were crowned in the Star Pathway and 14 new Leading Edge Champions were crowned in the Podium Pathway culminating the hard work and consistency of each skater.

Clubs and skating schools continue to embrace the CanSkate Element Events and the Star 1-3 Competitions. These events are hosted locally and there were 32 CanSkate Element Events hosted this season, compared to 26 in the prior year, and 47 Star 1-3 Competitions were offered, noting an increase from 42 last season. These events and competitions provide an opportunity for skaters to experience performing within their local club's environment, highlighting the club's development and growth.







2024 INTERNATIONAL ADULT FIGURE SKATING COMPETITION

Demonstrating the commitment to 'Skating for Everyone' Skate AB | NT | NU was honored to host the 2024 International Adult Figure Skating Competition on Tsuut'ina Nation Land at the Seven Chiefs Sportsplex & Jim Starlight Centre. This marked the first ever international figure skating competition held on a First Nation in Canada. The Section welcomed 275 adult skaters from 14 countries who participated in singles, dance, pairs and synchronized skating events, as well as workshops and social activities throughout the week. A total of 126 athletes from our Section competed in the event which was made possible thanks to the support of more than 160 dedicated volunteers and officials.









The 2024-2025 was a very busy season as the sport embraced the second season of the revised Skate Canada competition calendar. Pre-Novice and Novice Challenge was blended with Novice Canadians into the Skate Canada Trophy thus eliminating one competition in the calendar. Skate Canada Trophy was hosted in Edmonton and allowed for athletes to compete in their home Section.

SKATING PROGRAMS

Star

A Star seminar for Star 4 – Gold skaters was held in Red Deer, October 26-27, 2024. Two one-day seminars were offered with the option to do one or both days. Kaetlyn Osmond and Ben Ferreira were the on-ice facilitators, dryland sessions in dance, and classroom sessions for rules were offered. 51 skaters and 16 coaches participated.





Synchronized Skating

- A new initiative to assist Junior and Senior synchronized skating teams was approved for the 2024-2025 competition season. The purpose of the initiative was to raise the standard of the teams' performances. Marilyn Langlois, coach of 2024 World Champions Les Supremes Synchronized Skating Team, worked with our Senior Elite 12 Team and provided mentorship for the skaters and their coaching team.

- Black Gold Elite 12 competed amongst the senior teams at the 2025 Canadian National Skating Championships, in Laval, QC in January 2025
- Four Section teams qualified at Mountain Regionals for Canada Cup. Black Gold Novice, Black Gold Gold, Solstice Gold and Solstice Open all attended the Canada Cup Synchronized Skating Championships in Waterloo, Ontario, February 28 – March 2, 2025




