Categories offered:

- Star 1 (half ice) - All elements, stroking exercise and Creative
- Star 2 Freeskate Program
- Star 3 Freeskate Program

Entry fees:

- Cost \$75/event
- Refund of entry fees: Entry fees, less a \$10 administration fee, will be refunded if application is made prior to the closing date of entries. After the closing date of entries, March 15, there will be no refunds given for any reason, including medical pulls. No exceptions will be made.

Registration check-in: Skaters and coaches must check in one hour prior to their event.

GENERAL INFORMATION

All Star categories must follow the SKATE CANADA 2025-2026 technical requirements; inclusive of the well-balanced program criteria as posted on the Skate Canada Members Info Centre at Competition Program Requirements.

System of marking: The event is following the Skate Canada Star Event Standards for Assessment Guide.

Warm-up times:

- Star 1 & Star 2 – 3 minutes
- Star 3 – 4 minutes

Coach accreditation: All coaches must be minimally certified NCCP Regional in-training and Coaches must register at the registration desk. Coaches must be in good standing with Skate Canada.

Awards:

- The awards ceremony for each flight will be held approximately 15 minutes after conclusion of each event in the awards area.
- All skaters are requested to wear skates with hard guards for the awards ceremony.

Pictures and Videos: Persons wishing to take photographs of on ice performances are reminded that use of flash cameras is forbidden. NOTE: You may only take pictures or videos of your own skater and must be taken from the spectator seating areas, to not hamper the progress of the competition.
