Star 2	<u>Program Event</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Assessed to standard Introduction to skating a program in a figure skating event

Star 3	<u>Program Event</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Assessed to standard Skating a program with increased difficulty
Marking System:	Star 1-3 will be judged as per the Star Event Standards for Assessment Guide.
Awards:	Star 1 -3 skaters will receive a scoresheet and a Gold, Silver or Bronze ribbon <ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is the responsibility of skaters to wear their skates and skating attire for the medal presentations The awards ceremony for each flight will be held approximately 20 minutes after the conclusion of each event category in the Multi-Purpose Room
Evaluators/Judge:	The event is being held under the current Skate AB NT NU and the Star 1-3 Competition guidelines and will include 1 Skate AB NT NU Judge.
Warm-Up Times:	Skate Canada has standardized warm-up times for events.

Protest Policy:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Skate Canada Protest Policy for competitions will be followed. As this event: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> is using manual calculation, the results will not be posted does not have a technical representative, the Judge will fulfill this role The skater's <u>coach</u> must make the protest to the Judge within 1 hour after the competition has completed. There is no exception to this rule.
Additional Information:	
1	Spectators: Spectators are permitted and there are no restrictions. In the event of any restrictions being implemented by the facility, those will be adhered to.
2	Accidents: The Association and Committee of the Host Club take no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by the skater. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in this event, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by, or connected with the conduct and management of the competitions. An agreement must also be deemed to release any, and all claims they may have against the officials, the Association, the Host Club, and their officers. Entries shall be accepted only in accordance with these conditions.
3	Pictures and Video: Persons wishing to take photographs of on ice performances are reminded that use of flash cameras is not permitted. The use of video cameras must be restricted to areas that do not disturb or interrupt the skaters or officials. NOTE: You may only take pictures or videos of your own skater.
