



PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS OF SKATE CANADA: ALBERTA – NWT/NUNAVUT

This document outlines all submitted proposed amendments to the bylaws of Skate Canada: Alberta – NWT/Nunavut for consideration at the 2026 Annual General Meeting, being held on June 6, 2026, in accordance with Article 13 of the Bylaws.

Please note that as per Article 13, any member of Skate Canada: Alberta – NWT/Nunavut may submit bylaw proposals, amendments, or repeals in writing to the Executive Director a minimum of ninety 90 days in advance of the Annual General Meeting at which they are to be considered.

Amendments have been presented as follows:

- Effective date of the amendment

Additionally, and as per Article 13, Skate Canada: Alberta-NWT/Nunavut members have until 52 days prior to the Annual General Meeting to respond (April 15, 2026), via written submission to the Executive Director of Skate Canada: Alberta – NWT/Nunavut, to any such proposed amendments.

The contents of this document, along with any responses received on or prior to April 15, 2026, will be circulated to the Membership no later than 21 days prior to the Annual General Meeting (May 16, 2026).

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS OF SKATE CANADA: ALBERTA – NWT/NUNAVUT

Recommended Bylaw Amendment 1 of 1

Submitted by: Skate Canada: Alberta – NWT/Nunavut Board of Directors

Effective date: Upon approval at the Skate Canada: Alberta – NWT/Nunavut AGM, June 6, 2026, and filed by Corporate Registry.

Recommended change: Article 11.2 Management of Regions

Rationale: To remove the requirement of elected Region Representatives and for Regions to no longer be required to hold a Local Region Annual General Meeting.

Skate AB|NT|NU intends to maintain a non-elected Regions Committee and Local Regions Committees, which will continue to carry out their regular functions with operational support from the Section and in accordance with Section policies. Removing the requirement for members to be elected to these committees is intended to foster greater participation and reduce the administrative load of holding local Annual General Meetings. The Section, in collaboration with the existing committees, will recruit qualified volunteers to serve on these committees. The Section recognizes the valuable perspective offered by Clubs and Regions and wants to maintain this link while making it easier for volunteers to get involved.

The proposed bylaw changes do not remove the concept of Regions entirely. The definition of “Region” is maintained.

For clarification, the position of Director (Regions) on the Board of Directors remains unchanged. This elected position is not specifically linked to the management of Regions or anything else in Article 11.2. Candidates for Director (Regions) are restricted to current or former board members of a Club.

Recommended amendment:

~~11.2 — Management of Regions~~

~~The affairs of each Region consisting of two (2) or more clubs shall be managed by a Region Committee elected at a Region Annual General Meeting of the clubs within each Region, which meetings shall be held prior to the Annual General Meeting of the Section. In Regions consisting of one (1) club, the Regions Committee Lead or designate will manage the affairs of the Region. Regions will govern in accordance with Section policies.~~
