



2027 Leading Edge Series (2026-2027 season)

Information and FAQ

Focus of the Leading Edge Series

The Leading Edge Series is designed to reward recognition of competition results over the entirety of the Skate AB|NT|NU skating season. The Leading Edge Series calculates each skaters' average score from all eligible competitions in which they compete a freeskate program within a season.

Each season the focus continues to be to educate coaches and skaters about LTD (Long Term Development), which provides the fundamental structure for skaters balancing their training and competitions.

The intention of the Leading Edge Series in this regard is not for skaters to attend as many competitions as possible to improve their ranking, but to best determine a competition plan which balances competition and training over the course of the season which might best support skaters for optimal performances.

Structure of the Leading Edge Series

- **Freeskate Scores**
Freeskate program scores will be tabulated for the skater's Leading Edge score. Podium Pathway skaters do not need to complete a combined event in order for their score to qualify for the Leading Edge Series. Skate AB|NT|NU skaters who complete freeskate programs at any eligible competitions will be awarded points towards their Leading Edge scores.
- **Average Score**
The average score will be tabulated. A skater's Leading Edge score will reflect their average freeskate program score across all eligible competitions in a given season, calculated by dividing the cumulative freeskate program total score by the total number of eligible competitions completed. Skaters will be eligible for the Leading Edge Series once they have obtained a minimum of two (2) freeskate program scores within a common skating category.
- **NEW - Removal of Lowest Score**
When a skater has three (3) or more eligible freeskate scores within a season, the lowest score will be removed when calculating the skater's average final score. The removal of the skaters lowest score will be done only at the end of the Leading Edge Series season before the final average scores are calculated at the Sectional Championships and the StarSkate Championships.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

1. Who is eligible for the Leading Edge Series?

Skaters who are registered with Skate AB|NT|NU for the 2026-2027 skating season are eligible to compete in the Leading Edge Series. Eligible skaters who complete freeskate programs at the Leading Edge Series competitions listed above in either Podium Pathway or Star Pathway categories will be automatically awarded points towards their Leading Edge Series score.

2. What happens if a skater is registered with Skate Canada for the start of the Leading Edge Series and then does not register as a skater or compete starting Sept 1 for the new registrant season when the Series concludes?

Since the Leading Edge Series spans over two Skate Canada registrant seasons, it is possible for a skater to start the Leading Edge Series in one registrant season and then not be a registrant and not compete for the second season in which the Leading Edge Series concludes. If the skater meets the eligible criteria for the Leading Edge Series during the time they were a Skate Canada registrant, the skater will be recognized for their achievements within the Leading Edge Series.

3. Do skaters need to register for the Leading Edge Series?

No – eligible skaters will be automatically registered for the Leading Edge Series by Skate AB|NT|NU upon obtaining a freeskate program score at an eligible Leading Edge Series competition. In order to be eligible to participate in the Leading Edge Series, skaters must complete a minimum of two (2) freeskate programs within the same skating category.

4. How are the scores tabulated to determine standing in the Leading Edge Series?

A skater's Leading Edge Series score will be calculated by averaging the freeskate program scores across all eligible competitions. For 3 or more scores, the lowest score will be removed from the final calculation of scores.

Examples:

- If a skater completes two (2) eligible Leading Edge Series competitions, the total freeskate score from both competitions will be averaged to produce their Leading Edge Series score.
- If an athlete completes four (4) eligible Leading Edge Series competes, the lowest score will be removed and then the total freeskate score from the remaining three (3) competitions will be averaged to produce their Leading Edge Series score.

5. Can a skater use scores from out of province or non-Leading Edge Series competitions towards their Leading Edge Series score?

No – only the Skate AB|NT|NU competitions listed above are eligible for Leading Edge Series scores.



- 6. If a skater changes categories or pathways during the skating season, which category will their Leading Edge Series score be tabulated for (ex: a skater competes in Star 6 at Sunsational and Wild Rose, then competes in Juvenile U12 at the Fall Invitational and the Sectional Championships)?**

A skater's Leading Edge Series score will be tabulated for each category they compete in separately. As such, it is possible for an athlete to participate in more than one (1) Leading Edge Series category within the same skating season.

- 7. Can a skater use scores from a lower level category towards a higher level?**

No – Leading Edge Series scores are not transferable between categories or pathways. A category is defined as each category group. For example, Juvenile, Star 6, etc.

- 8. If a category at an eligible competition is an exhibition skate, will the skater's score still be tabulated for the Leading Edge Series?**

Yes – as long as a skater obtains a freeskate program score, it will be tabulated towards their Leading Edge Series score.

- 9. Can a skater be eligible for the Leading Edge Series if they only compete in one competition?**

No – a skater must complete a minimum of two (2) eligible competitions within the same skating category to be eligible for the Leading Edge Series.

- 10. What if a category has only one (1) skater in the final standings?**

The Leading Edge Series award will still be presented to that skater.

- 11. When will the medallists of the Leading Edge Series be awarded?**

The top three (3) skaters in each Leading Edge Series category will receive their awards at their respective Championships. Should a skater place in the top three (3) in multiple categories, they will be recognized in the highest category in which they placed.

If a skater places in the top three (3) within the same category but different age groups within the same category, they will be awarded the medal within both age groups. For example: if a skater placed in the top 3 in Juvenile U12 and Juvenile U14 and meets the eligible criteria for the Leading Edge Series, the skater will receive a medal in both age groups.

- 12. How will skaters and coaches be able to track their progress in the Leading Edge Series?**

Skate AB|NT|NU will post and update the Leading Edge Series standing for each category on the Section website as soon as possible following the conclusion of each eligible competition.

It is recommended that skaters and coaches track their progress to ensure their scores are accurately reflected in the Series. If a tabulation error is noted in a skater's score, please email the Section Office at events@skateabnwtun.ca.



13. Can a skater be withdrawn from the Leading Edge Series?

Yes – if a skater chooses not to participate in the Leading Edge Series, their coach may request for the skater to be removed from the Series for the duration of the skating season by emailing events@skateabnwtun.ca. This request must be submitted no later than one (1) week prior to the start of their respective Championships competition.
